1 SURVEY AIM & RESPONSE

The aim of the this survey was to enquire as to the requirements for obtaining Instructor ratings of various types, under National Parachute Association/Federation regulations, and within Military organisations, with a view to seeing if there is similarity or otherwise regarding requirements. The study may help those associations or federations who wish to establish standards, or who may wish to update their requirements, for Instructor ratings.

3 NOTES ON CATEGORIES OF INSTRUCTOR AND GENERAL RELEVANT INFORMATION

Country	Notes
Australia	The Australian Parachute Federation has no separate requirements for Professional and Recreational Instructors – the terms are not used at all.
	The Australian Parachute Federation has an instructor system that works starting at Tutor and finishes at Instructor A.
	Please note that many Instructors holding more than one training type endorsement (e.g. S/L, TM and AFF).
	Tutor for wingsuiting, RW, and Freefly. Completed a written and practical examination with a pass of 80%+.
	Instructor D with endorsements AFF, Tandem and Static Line (privileges include jumpmaster duties) Minimum Certificate D, 200 stable delays, Star crest, packer rating. Completed a written, oral and practical examination with a pass of 80%+.
	Instructor C with endorsements AFF, Tandem and Static Line (privileges include DZSO duties for endorsements held) Minimum Certificate E, 500 stable delays, Star crest, packer rating & have held ID for 6 months. Completed a written, oral and practical examination with a pass of 80%+.
	Instructor B endorsements AFF and Static Line (privileges include First Jump Course Trainer, Area Safety Officer) Minimum Certificate E, 500 stable delays, Star crest, packer rating & have held ID or IC for 6 months. Completed a written, oral and practical examination with a pass of 80%+.
	Instructor A endorsements AFF, Tandem and Static Line (privileges include Chief Instructor, Instructor Examiner, Technical Director for Safety or Instruction) Minimum Certificate E, 500 stable delays, Star crest, packer rating & have held IB for minimum 2 years. Have completed a thesis on a subject acceptable to the Director Instructors and a written, oral and practical examination with a pass of 80%+.
	Each state of Australia has an Instructor Panel Chair (IPC) who co-ordinates examiners in the State Council Area. The IPC's are managed by the Director Instructor (A national voluntary appointment) and the Manager Training (An APF employee)

Bulgaria	There is no difference in requirements for Professional and Recreational Instructors.

Estonia	Estonia does not have separate requirements for Professional and Recreational Instructor ratings.
	IAD and SL instructor: at least 18 years old, continuously valid C- or D-licence for last 12 months, proof of 300 freefall jumps. Currency requirements: at least 40 jumps, 1 ground school, 15 IAD/SL jumps for students in last calendar year. Must have made at least 3 jumps during last 3 months before training IAD/SL students. In case of lost rating: must have at least 40 jumps in last 12 months or at least 25 jumps in last 3 months, must have 1 ground school under direct supervision of current IAD/SL instructor, must carry out 5 IAD/SL jumps under direct supervision of current IAD/SL instructor.
	Tandem instructor: at least 21 years old, valid D-licence, 5 hours of freefall. Currency requirements: 40 freefall jumps, 1 ground school, 15 tandem jumps in last calendar year. Must have made at least 3 solo jumps in last 3 months and 1 probation with at least B-category holder as passenger before taking real passengers. In case of lost rating: must have at least 40 jumps in last 12 months or at least 25 jumps in last 3 months, must take theory exam and 1 jump with current tandem instructor as passenger
	AFF instructor: at least 21 years old, valid D-licence, 6 hours of freefall. Currency requirements: 40 freefall jumps, 1 ground school, 15 AFF jumps in last calendar year. Must have made at least 10 freefall jumps in last 3 months, must make at least 1 probation jump with person who has or had AFF instructor rating. In case of lost rating: must have at least 40 jumps in last 12 months or at least 25 jumps in last 3 months, must have theory exam and 1 jump with current AFF instructor as student, must have 1 ground school under direct supervision of current AFF instructor.
Hong Kong, China	There is no difference in requirements for Professional and Recreational Instructors.
Luxembourg	No Professional Instructor rating in Luxembourg.
Netherlands	No difference between Professional and Recreational Instructor.
Norway	We do not have Professional Instructors.
Saudi Arabia	There are higher criteria for Professional Instructors, then for Recreational Instructors in all categories of instruction.
South Africa	There is no distinction between Professional and Recreational Instructors.
Spain	Spain does not have separate requirements for Professional and Recreational Instructor ratings.
Turkey	Only Professional Instructors in Turkey.
United Kingdom	All sport parachuting in the UK (civilian recreational or professional and military) is conducted under British Parachute Association requirements and all are BPA members operating at BPA clubs.
Uruguay	All Instructors must be 'D' Licensed before any kind of examination, therefore they are professionals. Sport parachuting instruction is done with Static Line.
